In December of 2015, Floyd Bledsoe was exonerated of first-degree murder after spending fifteen years in prison. Though he was sentenced to life in prison, he could have been sentenced death due to to the circumstances of the crime.

While in prison, Bledsoe focused on serving his fellow inmates, gaining an education, and seeking a path to forgiveness for those who wrongfully imprisoned him.

Since being exonerated, Bledsoe volunteers his time at a prison re-entry program in Hutchinson. He also speaks in support of repealing the death penalty, and other criminal justice reforms that would reduce wrongful convictions.
